The Everest Panorama Trek is a year-round trekking adventure. As this is a mild form of exploration to experience the magnificence of the Everest region, it can be done throughout the year. However, for the best value experience, we recommend the peak seasons, spring and autumn.

During these peak seasons, the beauty of the region is at its peaks, and they also provide more exploration prospects under pleasant climatic conditions. You will also have more cultural encounters during these peak months, which certainly will add value to your experience.

The temperature in the lower Everest regions averages between **12°C to 17°C** during the autumn season. On the other hand, spring accommodates you with slightly warmer temperatures than the autumn season; the daytime temperature in this season ranges between **17°C to 25°C**.

If you plan to do this trek during the off seasons like winter and monsoon, you need to pack proper layers and helpful equipment to overcome the challenging weather conditions.

- Day 01: Flight from Kathmandu [1,400 meters/ 4,593 feet] to Lukla [2,800 meters/ 9,186
- feet] and trek to Phakding [2,610 meters/ 8,562 feet]
- Day 02: Phakding to Namche Bazaar [3,440 meters/ 11,286 feet] trekking
- Day 03: Namche Bazaar to Thame [3,800 meters/ 12,467 feet]
- Day 04: Trekking from Thame to Khumjung [3,750 meters/ 12,303 feet] via Everest
- Hotel View [3,962 meters/ 13,000 feet]
- Day 05: Khumjung to Tengboche [3,860 meters/ 12,664 feet] trek
- Day 06: Trekking back to Namche [3,440 meters/ 11,286 feet] from Tengboche
- Day 07: Namche Bazaar to Lukla [2,800 meters/ 9,186 feet]
- Day 08: Flight back from Lukla to Kathmandu [1,400 meters/ 4,593 feet]
