

Here are some things you should know before heading for the Tibet Tour.

- Reach the border of Nepal and Tibet, Kerung
- Explore the culturally rich Lhasa City and its destinations like Potala Palace, Sera and Drepung Monastery, and Panchen Lama's Tashilhumpu Monastery.
- Reach the highest pass of Gyatsu La Pass at 5220 meters above sea level

Cost Includes

- Permits and entry fees: The entry and permit charges to various landmarks and sites are included in cost.
- Transportation: The transportation charges within Tibet, Bus Fare From and To Tibet
